Phonics and Reading

We hope you found the phonics meeting useful. Please access this on seesaw when needed for further support. Please could you continue practising the sounds in your child's orange phonics journal and ticking each time they have read the sound correctly. It can be helpful for you to put a small dot or no tick if you feel they were incorrect or unsure. Please make sure your child's pronunciation is correct.



Share a story

This half term we are finding out about Autumn. We will walk round the school grounds looking for signs of Autumn e.g. leaves that have changed colour, fallen leaves, acorns and berries on the trees. Please encourage your child to look for signs of Autumn in your garden or when they are coming to school. We will also be learning about animals that hibernate. We will also be looking at the festivals of Bonfire night and Diwali.

Each week, your child will bring home a story from school. This book will be part of our Early Years library. The book will come home on a Tuesday and we ask that it is returned on a Friday. We hope you enjoy sharing an additional book with your child.

Special books

We have enjoyed sharing your children's special books each Wednesday afternoon so far. Please can we ask that they only complete 1 page and this can be done using photographs, drawings or sentences about an experience from home.

Naming clothes

Please remember to mark your child's name clearly on the outside of lunch boxes and on the inside of cardigans and sweatshirts. Now that the weather is getting colder and children are beginning to wear hats, scarves, gloves and mittens, these too need to be named. It is so much easier to return lost items
